AAHOA applauds Labor spending bill’s provisions on joint employer and overtime

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Asian American Hotel Owners Association President and CEO Chip Rogers released the following statement regarding the House Appropriations Committee’s draft of the Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education spending bill, which includes provisions relating to the expanded joint employer standard and the new overtime rule:

“The expanded joint employer standard and the Labor Department’s overtime rule is already causing great harm to small business owners—including AAHOA’s more than 15,000 members—and the millions of jobs they have created across the country. We commend Chairman Hal Rogers and subcommittee Chairman Tom Cole for working diligently to roll back these misguided initiatives. We urge lawmakers in the House to swiftly pass the bill and work with the Senate to see that it becomes law.”
