



AAHOA President to Speak on Travel in a Post-Crisis World

ATLANTA, April 19, 2016 - The Asian American Hotel Owners Association (AAHOA) President and CEO, Chip Rogers, will address north Atlanta Rotarians tomorrow afternoon at the weekly meeting of the Rotary Club of Emory - Druid Hills.

The organization, with a motto of “service above self,” meets every Wednesday.

Rogers is expected to speak at length on the state of the American travel industry, particularly as it relates to hotels and hotel owners, and to describe the evolution of travel and tourism in the post-9/11 world. He will also provide background information on AAHOA, discuss how AAHOA members successfully weathered the 2008 financial crisis, and answer hospitality industry-related questions from the group.

“It’s always a pleasure to speak before community groups like Rotary,” Rogers said. “It’s an excellent opportunity to share what AAHOA is doing with people outside hospitality and to get a sense of how we - both AAHOA and the hotel industry - are generally perceived.”

The meeting will be held at Ashiana restaurant and banquet hall in Norcross, Ga., from 12:15 to 1:30 PM.

AAHOA is the largest hotel owner’s association in the United States. The more than 15,000 AAHOA members own almost 50% of all U.S. based hotels. Each year AAHOA members donate hundreds of thousands of dollars to their local communities.

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
